**1. Public Works Action Items**

- 1.1. Suburban Chamber of Greater Montgomery – The committee approved to put forth a motion and resolution to full council for approval to hang the banners.
- 1.2. 2026 Microsurfacing Program – The committee voted to put forth a motion to full council for approval to prepare and advertise this project
- 1.3. Edgemont Avenue & W. Third Street – The committee voted to put forth a motion to full council for approval to prepare and advertise this project.
- 1.4. International Festival banners – The committee voted to put forth a motion and resolution to full council for approval to hang the banners.
- 1.5. Montco 2040 Grant Application – The committee voted to put forth a motion and resolution to authorize the Borough Manager submitting the grant application. This grant is for pedestrian safety improvements at the intersection of Lakeview Drive and E. Main Street and adding an ADA-complaint crosswalk at Mitchell and W. Main Street.

**4. Public Works Update**

- 4.1. PennDOT Striping – Main & N. Broad Street - With warmer weather, line striping on Main Street will be completed, and PennDOT will begin a project to add drive aisles and crosswalks on North Broad Street.  
The department is also managing equipment maintenance after a challenging winter and recently completed an in-house stormwater project. A prototype speed hump made of stone grit was installed on Ninth Street for evaluation by officials and the public.

**5. WWTP Update**

- 5.1. WWTP Update - The department received its draft five-year MPDES permit, which includes new quarterly monitoring requirements for PFAS compounds and dinitrotoluene, as well as future limits on free cyanide. Updates were given on the White Road Pump Station chemical feed project, an emergency sewer main issue near Valley Forge and West Main, and progress on Pennvest funding for the Poplar and Cannon Avenue sewer upgrades. The facility is also undergoing extensive interior painting.

**8. New Business** - The committee agreed to hold future discussions on two new topics:

- 1. Proactive Sidewalk Enforcement: A proposal to move beyond a complaint-based system to more aggressively enforce the sidewalk maintenance ordinance to improve safety and walkability.
- 2. Municipal Trash Collection: Addressing issues of overflowing trash cans along Main Street and exploring the possibility of bringing municipal collection in-house, a conversation prompted by a county commissioner.

**9. Public Comment** – There was a comment of doing curb painting during a road construction project. A question was raised on what the grant the borough received through Representative Malagari for automated red-light enforcement at six intersections in the borough was exactly about.
